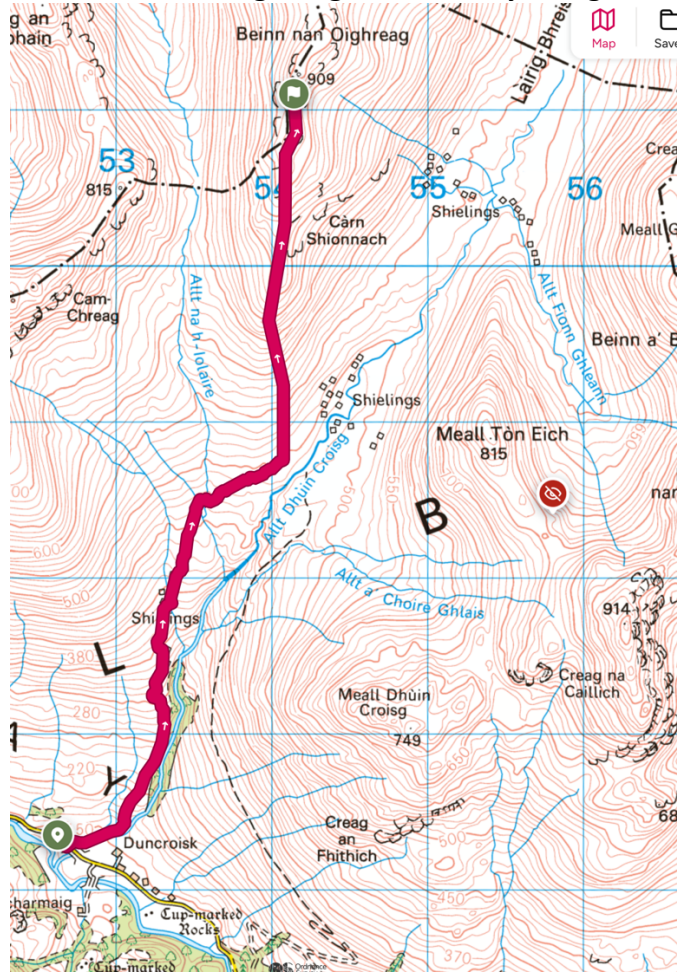


Beinn nan Oighreag, Glen Lochay – August 3rd 2026



7.5 miles, 5 hrs, 2,460 ft ascent, Highest point 909 m (2,980 ft)

A group of 7 met at Broxden and later at the walk start a few miles from Killin on a cloudy misty day with light drizzle. We had set out to climb the Corbett Beinn nan Oighreag (Hill of the Cloudberries) which at 2,980 ft falls just below the minimal height for a Munro.

The walk start recommended by Walk Highlands was not possible due to activities related to deer management but an alternate path a mile further up the road had been indicated on a sign.

The approach was fairly straight forward with a defined path at first but essentially making our own way over heather for the main ascent. A steep climb up towards Carn Shionnach was followed by coffee break before pushing on to the summit marked by a very rudimentary cairn of 3 stones!

The weather on the summit was breezy but not sufficient to move the mist and unfortunately the views were restricted. However, on our descent the cloud did lift and we did get a good view of the valley. We reached the cars in good time, only slightly damp and in high spirits ready to taste the delights of Kula Coffee Shop in Killin. Suitably refreshed we were able to reach Perth by 5.30pm.
